

BATTERY PARK CITY AUTHORITY RELEASES SUMMER EVENT SCHEDULE

Return of In-Person Programming Highlighted by Free Events & Exhibitions this June, July, and August

The Battery Park City Authority (BPCA) today released its <u>Summer 2021 event</u> <u>schedule</u> detailing dozens of free public programs and events – including art, music, dance, comedy, walking tours, virtual screenings, and more – taking place across Battery Park City from June through August. "Please join us in safely enjoying long-time community favorites like our River & Blues outdoor concerts, Sunset Jam drumming circles, and the Battery Dance Festival, as well as the return of the River to River Festival, Strings-on-Hudson, and our annual Juneteenth celebration, and so much more!"

Glick**. "Their events reflect the breadth and diversity of New York City and will provide a much-needed opportunity to safely celebrate arts and culture after a challenging year."

As a result of COVID-19 restrictions, in April 2020 BPCA transitioned to an all-virtual programming lineup, utilizing its **YouTube Channel** to share videos produced by its Parks Programming team – including music, art, athletics, nature, cooking, culture, and more. With its Summer 2021 event schedule, Battery Park City marks a return to the large-scale, in-person programming that has been an annual community highlight for decades.

• Interventions – Mildred Howard: "In the Line of Fire" and Ned Smyth: "Moments of Matter and Life." In partnership with the Shirley Fiterman Art Center (SFAC) at Borough of Manhattan Community College, Interventions features works by internationally recognized artists Mildred Howard and Ned Smyth – both of whom also have works on display in Battery Park City. The exhibition will be viewed from the exterior of the SFAC galleries through the large, street-front windows on Barclay Street, Park Place and West Broadway.

Howard's "In the Line of Fire" consists of numerous, repeated life-size figures, which are made up of cut-out plywood soldiers that together form a standing regiment. The figures have been silkscreen-printed with a single recurring image – a young man in his teens, who was a distant relative of the artist and who had been drafted or enlisted into the U.S. Army during the First World War. Howard's work not only points to the history of racism in this country, but also raises fundamental questions surrounding what it means to be American.

Smyth's "Moments of Matter and Life" pairs some of the artist's early post-Minimal work from the 1970s with a group of his most recent sculptural and photographic investigations on the shapes and textures of stones and twigs that he has been continuously collecting. Experimenting with large format, black and white photographs, as well as sculpture, Smyth obsessively explores aspects of definition, texture, and scale.
