V. BPC Parks Happenings!

- Battery Park City's Parks Operations team focuses daily on a range of tasks to maintain BPC's world-class standards. Here are some examples of what's happening in December —
 - ✓ The Ice Wall Cometh: Teardrop
 Park's bluestone ice wall uses recirculated water during the winter
 months to form ice on its surface.
 As the temperature drops this
 season you'll see the wall's
 customary ice forming.
 - ✓ Frozen Out: Winterization of Battery Park City's drinking fountains and irrigation systems is now complete.



- ✓ **Green Future:** Plant orders for the 2023 season are underway, helping BPCA secure the best quality plants for the neighborhood's parks and public spaces.
- ✓ Seeping through: Battery Park City aims to have nearly half of its parks and public open spaces be permeable by 2030. Permeable pavements and green stormwater infrastructure can help to reduce flooding risks by providing opportunities for stormwater to infiltrate or slow down runoff,



- while also filtering and cleaning runoff through green infrastructure. As part of this work, BPCA will begin its <u>permeable paver pilot project</u> at the South Cove cul-de-sac toward the end of the month.
- ✓ **Leafing Waste Behind:** BPCA's Parks Operations team has switched to reusable bags for the collection of fallen leaves along parks pathways this year, saving a minimum of 500 plastics bags to date. Some leaves are also left where they land to contribute to that "fall feel" throughout Battery Park City's parks.
- ✓ When the bough breaks: Parks visitors will start seeing evergreen boughs placed
 - in the garden beds throughout the neighborhood for aesthetics as well as to protect the plants and soil for the winter season.
- ✓ Winning with Zero Waste: As a decades-long leader in sustainability, BPCA is striving to divert 90% of what is sent to landfill! To continue helping toward our Zero Waste goal, we ask that you rethink what you are bringing into the parks, and if possible please recycle or compost items.



VI. South Cove Quay Repairs

 In-kind rebuilding of the South Cove quay, damaged as a result of Tropical Storm Isaias, is now underway, with work expected to be complete by the end of the year.

XI. Parks Lawns REMINDER: Pet Free Areas Signage



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS & STATUS UPDATES

I. Holiday Lights Celebration

 The annual neighborhood seasonal celebration, with cozy beverages, sweet treats – and festive carols featuring Sing Harlem Choir and the P.S./I.S. 276 Advanced Chorus – took place in Rockefeller Park on Thursday evening, December 1. A great time was had by all!

II. 'Justice Reflected' Art Installation Opened on Esplanade Plaza Wall

- On November 11, BPCA <u>unveiled</u>
 <u>Justice Reflected</u>, a series of three
 mosaic panels created by critically
 acclaimed artist and muralist James
 Yaya Hough.
- The temporary public art installation uses glass compositions to depict the experiences of incarcerated people, evoking feelings of isolation, despair, fear, and hope.
- Hough had been incarcerated for 27 years and now uses art as a medium to

amplify the voices of incarcerated people and raise awareness and empathy for those directly impacted by the American justice system. Justice Reflected is planned to be on

display for one year.

III. BPC Added to New York State Birding Trail

- In October the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation announced the addition of 13 new locations to the NYS Birding Trail; this brings total number of birding trail locations to 325 statewide, providing a variety of quality birding experiences for New Yorkers and visitors to enjoy.
- Statewide <u>trail network</u> includes promoted birding locations that can be accessed by car or public transport, providing an inclusive experience for all visitors to enjoy birds amid beautiful natural settings with little or no cost or investment in equipment.

VI. COMMUNITY REMINDER – Manhattan Weekly Resurfacing Schedule

- Like all infrastructure, roadways deteriorate over time due to wear and tear from use, from the weathering by heat, freezing and thawing, and precipitation. Resurfacing and reconstruction is determined by a multitude of factors. The NYC Department of Transportation conducts regular inspections to assess pavement conditions, and assigns ratings based on the overall condition, patching, and cracking.
