

#### **NEIGHBORHOOD & PROJECT UPDATES:**


- **I.** <u>COVID-19 Vaccine</u> Get vaccinated and stay up to date with all recommended doses.
  - All New Yorkers 6 months and older should <u>get vaccinated</u> and get their <u>booster</u> <u>dose</u> when eligible. If you are experiencing symptoms or were exposed, <u>get tested</u>, and talk to your healthcare provider about <u>treatment</u> if you test positive.


#### IV. Coming Up This Month in BPC



## I. 'Justice Reflected' Art Installation Opened on Esplanade Plaza Wall

- Last November BPCA <u>unveiled Justice</u>
   <u>Reflected</u>, a series of three mosaic
   panels created by critically-acclaimed
   artist and muralist James Yaya Hough.
- The temporary public art installation uses glass compositions to depict the experiences of incarcerated people,
  - evoking feelings of isolation, despair, fear, and hope.

 Last October the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation announced the addition of 13 new locations to the NYS Birding Trail, which provides a variety of quality birding experiences for New Yorkers and visitors to enjoy.





 Statewide <u>trail network</u> includes promoted birding locations that can be accessed by car or public transport, providing an inclusive experience for all visitors to enjoy birds amid beautiful natural settings with little or no cost or investment in equipment.

#### VI. COMMUNITY REMINDER – Manhattan Weekly Resurfacing Schedule

- Like all infrastructure, roadways deteriorate over time due to wear and tear from use, from the weathering by heat, freezing and thawing, and precipitation. Resurfacing and reconstruction is determined by a multitude of factors. The NYC Department of Transportation conducts regular inspections to assess pavement conditions, and assigns ratings based on the overall condition, patching, and cracking.
