



VI. BPC Parks Happenings!

- Battery Park City's Parks Operations team focuses daily on a range of tasks to maintain BPC's world-class standards. Here are some examples of what's happening in February —
 - ✓ Paving the Way: The Authority continues with installation of new permeable pavers in the cul-de-sac along South End Avenue adjacent South Cove, with work expected to be completed this month. Permeable pavements and green stormwater infrastructure can help to reduce flooding risks by providing opportunities for stormwater to infiltrate or slow down runoff, while also filtering and cleaning this runoff.
 - ✓ On the Bench: Our Maintenance team is refinishing the teak benches relocated to the BPC Ball Fields Terrace from Wagner Park's south garden.
 - ✓ Off the Bench: Belvedere Plaza benches are being cleaned, sanded, oiled and refinished. While parks users may see one of the benches "missing" from time to time know it'll be back looking better than ever.
 - ✓ Right out of the gate: The West Thames dog run gates are being sequentially removed for repairs, with a temporary fence installed while work occurs. Public access to the run will be maintained via the gate not undergoing repair work.
 - ✓ **Just a trim:** Tree pruning will be taking place throughout our parks to ensure the safety and the health of the neighborhood's tree canopy.
 - ✓ Rat Remedy: Environmentally-friendly application of dry ice to reduce the rodent population will continue this month along the Eastern Border. READ MORE: <u>Rats!</u> <u>Battery Park City uses dry ice to kill vermin</u>
 - ✓ Spotting Spotted Lanternflies: This winter our team continues scouting, monitoring, and scraping Spotted Lanternfly egg masses throughout the park. READ MORE: The Spotted Lanternflies of Manhattan
 - ✓ Soil Toil: Soil samples taken throughout BPC for physical, chemical, and biological analyses will be reviewed to provide BPCA's horticulturists a better idea of our soil health.
 - ✓ **Until we chip again:** With collection of trees complete for the 2022-2023 holiday season, BPCA's annual tree recycling program is coming to close this week, with the final chipping session scheduled for February 2. Thanks to your efforts, this season more than 1,600 trees will have been chipped into mulch for use in BPC's parks and other greenspaces. SEE IT: **Chipping Trees in Battery Park City**
 - ✓ **Zero Waste:** As a decades-long leader in sustainability, BPCA is striving to divert 90% of what is sent to landfill! To continue helping toward our Zero Waste goal, we ask that you rethink what you throw away in the parks, and please recycle or compost items.




While leashed pets are permitted on hard surfaces throughout Battery Park City, they





V. COMMUNITY REMINDER – Manhattan Weekly Resurfacing Schedule

- Like all infrastructure, roadways deteriorate over time due to wear and tear from use, from the weathering by heat, freezing and thawing, and precipitation. Resurfacing and reconstruction is determined by a multitude of factors. The NYC Department of Transportation conducts regular inspections to assess pavement conditions, and assigns ratings based on the overall condition, patching, and cracking.
