- I. COVID-19 Vaccine Get vaccinated and stay up to date with all recommended doses.
 - All New Yorkers 6 months and older should <u>get vaccinated</u> and get their <u>booster</u>
 <u>dose</u> when eligible. If you are <u>experiencing symptoms</u> or were exposed, <u>get tested</u>,
 and talk to your healthcare provider about <u>treatment</u> if you test positive.

VI. BPC Parks Happenings!

- BPCA's Parks Operations team focuses daily on a range of tasks to maintain BPC's world-class standards. Here are some examples of what's happening in April —
 - ✓ Paving the way: After completion of work on South End Avenue's cul-de-sac, our second installation of pavers is nearing
 - completion along BPC's South Esplanade near The Upper Room. Later this month we'll move to the north to Rockefeller Park, along the pathway that runs on the west side of the north lawn near *Ulysses*.
 - \checkmark Spring has sprung: Our team will be working on energizing parks irrigation and water
 - utilities. And beginning April 17, we'll be receiving the season's first perennial and shrub deliveries for our team of dedicated horticulturists to add throughout our parks.
 - ✓ Serve it up: In mid-April, our Parks
 Operations team will lay down the
 volleyball matting, put up the net, and reinstall the benches around the court.
 - ✓ Memorial Fountain: Also in mid-April, the NYC Police Memorial fountain will be activated for the season in advance of the annual ceremony commemorating the additional names of those who have made the ultimate sacrifice.
 - ✓ Maintaining our parks: Carpenters will begin cleaning and water sealing the wood posts at Rockefeller Park Playground, and continue sealing Belvedere Plaza's benches with mineral oil. All benches at Albany Street and Rector Place will be returned as well.
 - ✓ **All abuzz**: On Monday, April 17, BPCA is hosting another of its popular Meet the Beekeeper events at the Rockefeller Park beehive.



- ✓ **Dog Waste Compost**: BPCAs dog waste composting program continues and is expanding. This spring we'll be receiving a new, dedicated dog waste composter capable of handling up to 100 lbs. of waste per day, allowing us to streamline our composting process and produce a quality product quicker.
- ✓ Tree Health: Pruning of street trees along
 North End Avenue is ongoing, with
 chipping of garden debris every Wednesday this month at Pier A Plaza (weather permitting).
- ✓ **Zero Waste**: As a decades-long leader in sustainability, BPCA is striving to divert 90% of what is sent to landfill! To continue helping toward our Zero Waste goal, we ask that you rethink what you throw away in the parks, and please recycle or compost items.

I. Robert Simko's Lower Manhattan: 50 Years of Photographs









<u>IF YOU SEEK HIS MONUMNENT, LOOK AROUND</u>: Friends and family of Robert Simko, longtime Battery Park City resident, neighbor, and friend, attend the opening of *Robert Simko's Lower Manhattan: 50 Years of Photographs* on Sunday, March 26 at 6 River Terrace.

 The showing celebrated Robert's life and legacy through some of his best work. After opening day, the exhibition was free to attend and open to the public from Monday, March 27 to Friday, March 31, 5 PM to 8PM, and on Saturday and Sunday, April 1 and 2, from 2PM to 6PM.

III. 'Justice Reflected' Art Installation Opened on Esplanade Plaza Wall

- Justice Reflected, on display through 2023, is a series of three mosaic panels created by critically-acclaimed artist and muralist James Yaya Hough.
- The temporary public art installation uses glass compositions to depict the experiences of incarcerated people, evoking feelings of isolation, despair, fear, and hope.

V. COMMUNITY REMINDER – Manhattan Weekly Resurfacing Schedule

- Like all infrastructure, roadways deteriorate over time due to wear and tear from use, from the weathering by heat, freezing and thawing, and precipitation. Resurfacing and reconstruction is determined by a multitude of factors. The NYC Department of Transportation conducts regular inspections to assess pavement conditions, and assigns ratings based on the overall condition, patching, and cracking.
