

 sustainable future together!












- ✓ Interludes: Cumbia River Band Thursday, September 21, 5:30PM @ Belvedere Plaza. In celebration of Hispanic Heritage Month and Climate Week, Cumbia River Band draws from a festive repertoire of Colombian Cumbia and Riverside melodies. Their sound features instruments such as the tuba, accordion, clarinet, percussion, and vocals, resembling the golden era of Cumbia with an American twist. Led by multi-instrumentalist, producer, and educator Martin Vejarano, the band's original compositions and cleverly arranged classics will transport you to the captivating musical world of Cumbia River.

IX. COMMUNITY REMINDER: Financial Assistance for Medicare Beneficiaries

- o The New York State Office for the Aging <u>is urging income-eligible Medicare</u>
 - beneficiaries in New York to apply for up to \$7,300 annually in financial assistance through an expansion in the Medicare Savings Program (MSP).
- The 2023 income eligibility limits are \$2,280 for an individual and \$3,077 for a couple.
