Details free events for all across Battery Park City from January through April

The Battery Park City Authority (BPCA) today released its <u>Winter 2024 Program & Event Guide</u>, detailing a broad range of free programming – including film, music, art and culture, nature, walking tours, fitness, and more – across Battery Park City from January through April. The Guide features illustrated program offerings organized by monthly event highlights, with community partners The Museum of Jewish Heritage – *A Living Memorial to the Holocaust* and Poets Houe, by those of interest to adults and seniors, school-aged children, and preschoolers, as well as information about community spaces at 200 Rector Place, 6 River Terrace, the BPC Ball Fields, and discounted membership rates at Battery Park City's Community Center at Stuyvesant High School. PIONEERS OF PUBLIC ART: NEW YORK IN THE 1980s & 1990s. An
extraordinary evening with artists Mary Miss, Ned Smyth, and R.M. Fischer, who
transformed Manhattan's downtown riverfront and the emerging neighborhood
built on landfill, Battery Park City, into an internationally-renowned public art
destination. A conversation with the influential artists follows the premier of
documentary shorts about their works: Smyth's Upper Room, Miss' South Cove,
and Fischer's Rector Gate.

- **AUSTRALIAN NEW WAVE**. Our latest film series focuses on the unique narratives that highlight Australian culture, history, and landscape. Free popcorn will be served, and a discussion will follow the screenings.
 - January 18: In Mad Max (1979, George Miller), a vengeful policeman sets out to stop a violent motorcycle gang in a near-future Australia on the edge of collapse.
 - February 8: The Last Wave (1977, Peter Weir) is a murder mystery about a lawyer defending five Aboriginal Persons, who in the process learns disturbing things about himself.
 - March 14: In The Chant of Jimmie Blacksmith (1978, Fred Schepisi) a man of half-Aboriginal ancestry is pushed to the breaking point that provokes a violent response when he brutally murders his employer's family.
 - April 11: Long Weekend (1978, Colin Eggleston) tells the story of a suburban couple who go camping for the weekend at a remote beach, where they discover that nature isn't in an accommodating mood.
