NEIGHBORHOOD & PROJECT UPDATES:

I. Welcome Back to Wagner Park!



- After a two-year closure, Wagner Park is set to reopen on **Tuesday, July 29**.
- A Reimagined Waterfront Destination Wagner Park closed in 2023 for a major reconstruction aimed at addressing urgent climate resilience needs driven by the increasing threat of severe storms such as Superstorm Sandy in 2012 which cost the lives of 44 New Yorkers and caused millions of dollars in damage to Battery Park City. The <u>new Wagner Park integrates flood protection and sustainable infrastructure</u> to safeguard Battery Park City and Lower Manhattan and is part of New York City's Lower Manhattan Coastal Resiliency Project.

- o REMINDER: Flood Barrier System "Mockups"
 - ✓ BPCA installing three wall "mockups" of the project's Flood Barrier System (FBS) at two neighborhood locations – South End Avenue & Third Place; and on opposing sides of Albany Street & BPC Esplanade.
 - ✓ Structures ranging from between 6'-8.5' high and 12'-16' in length to mimic the dimensions and appearance of the eventual FBS wall that will, upon completion, protect BPC and other portions of Lower Manhattan from flood events.

- o Wet My Plants...
 - ✓ Watering of hanging baskets and newly-planted trees is occurring thrice weekly to ensure optimal plant health.
