



## Site Readiness Work: Albany Street + Esplanade




#### **ACTIVE WORK AREAS: REACH 6**

- Albany Street end work zone with fencing, concrete barricades, sound blankets, and temporary site lighting installed with restricted access to this area.
- Noise, air, and vibration monitor installation to help manage and mitigate impacts of construction activity.
- Temporary pedestrian walkway to esplanade installed to connect from Albany St to the Esplanade.

#### WHAT IS NEXT:

- Extend work zone area to roundabout with barricades and fencing.
- Installation of detour signage and other way finding signage.
- Paving and furniture removals. Benches and light poles will be salvaged and stored.
- Excavation for utility work and utility monitoring installation to manage and mitigate construction impacts

### Site Readiness Work: North Cove Marina + Brookfield Place




#### **ACTIVE WORK AREAS: REACH 5**

- Concrete barricades, fencing, sound blanket installation to designate work zone area.
- Noise, air, and vibration monitor installation to help manage and mitigate impacts of construction activity.
- Pump House Park Tree pruning, protection, and removals.
- Artwork protection and removals for storage.

#### WHAT IS NEXT:

Demolition, excavation, utility monitoring, and utility relocation work.

## Site Readiness Work: North Esplanade + HRPT + 9A



#### **ACTIVE WORK AREAS: REACH 1**

- Stuyvesant Plaza subsurface utility survey (test pits).
- Concrete barricades, fencing, sound blanket installation to designate work area.

#### WHAT IS NEXT:

- Citibike docking station relocation to clear work area planned utility work at Stuyvesant Plaza.
- Road Closure and detour signage installation at Chambers Street
- Concrete barricades, fencing, sound blanket installation to designate work area.
- Noise, air, and vibration monitor installation to help manage and mitigate impacts of construction activity
- Excavation for utility work and utility monitoring installation.

The Battery Park City Realilenoy (BPCR) Project is creating a more resilient neighborhood. This will be accomplished with implementation of a coastal flood barrier system, designed to protect Battery Park City and parts of lower Manhattan. As we enter the next phase of the project, you'll see site readiness work across the neighborhood. This will help prepare for broader construction, scheduled to start in Spring 2026.

#### What to expect?

During this phase, you can expect to see work around the neighborhood such as test pits, utility relocation, tide gates, and underground assessments. There will also be construction barriers in key locations to maintain a safe working environment for our team and the RPC community.
