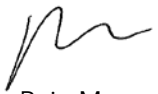

As we look ahead to the many cultural and community events, we also take time to reflect on moments that have shaped our neighborhood and our nation.

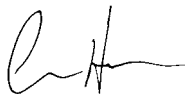
